



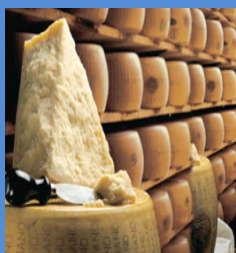

PARMA, RECOGNIZED CREATIVITY AT THE TABLE

Parma and the typical products of the Food Valley, sought after all over the world, have obtained the UNESCO recognition of “Creative City for Gastronomy”, the first to represent Italy in the food sector with its flagship products: Parmigiano Reggiano and Prosciutto di Parma. It is also present in the list of “Creative Cities of UNESCO” of which there are only 60 in the whole world.

UNIVERSITY OF PARMA: AN INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

The University of Parma includes over 35,000 persons within the Academic Community with 33,000 students and over 1,000 professors and researchers. The university study programmes are 111, including Nursing School, with 11 different locations in the city. The University of Parma has also set up International Institutional Agreements signed with Universities in countries all over the world and has taken part in the project of the Emilia Romagna (where Parma is located) Regional Government on the project General States of Health. The regional government is considered as one of the best worldwide in terms of health coverage and good practices.

A CITY OF INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITIONS AT THE FIERE DI PARMA

PLACES WORTH VISITING IN ONE DAY



1. Parma Cathedral (Cattedrale di Parma), a Romanesque masterpiece from the 12th century. Please visit the dome fresco by Correggio – a stunning work of High Renaissance illusionism;

2. Baptistry of Parma (Battistero di Parma), next to the Cathedral, built in pink Verona marble, one of the most important medieval monuments in Italy, transitional between Romanesque and Gothic. Famous for its intricate bas-reliefs and the frescoed ceiling;

3. Church of San Giovanni Evangelista, next to the Cathedral, so it's an easy double-visit. It hosts another stunning Correggio fresco;

4. Camera di San Paolo, a small but dazzling room painted by Correggio with Renaissance mythological themes. This is a hidden gem, often overlooked but a real treat for art lovers;

5. Teatro Regio (Royal Theatre), one of Italy's most prestigious opera houses, commissioned by Maria Luigia of Austria. Even if you can't attend a performance, try to book a guided tour;



6. Basilica di Santa Maria della Steccata, a remarkable example of Renaissance architecture. Its name derives from the Italian word *steccato*, meaning "fence";
7. Monument to Giuseppe Verdi, in Piazza della Pace and nearby Verdi Street. Giuseppe Verdi was born nearby in Busseto and is a cultural icon in Parma;
8. Palazzo della Pilotta, a massive complex housing key cultural institutions and including the Teatro Farnese – an entirely wooden baroque theater from 1618-, the National Gallery – with works by Correggio, Parmigianino, Leonardo da Vinci, and Canaletto, the Archaeological Museum and Bodoni Museum;
9. Parco Ducale & Palazzo del Giardino, a formal 16th-century park and palace, once the residence of the Dukes of Parma, for a relaxed walk and seeing Italian-style garden design.

Looking for a Parma One-Day Walking Itinerary suggestion?

START: Parma Cathedral in Piazza Duomo - Baptistry of Parma (right next door) - Church of San Giovanni Evangelista (2 min walk), Coffee break at Caffè Cavour à Camera di San Paolo (5 min walk) - Palazzo della Pilotta (5 min walk) with Teatro Farnese, National Gallery, Archaeological Museum - Giuseppe Verdi Monument - Lunch at Ristorante La Forchetta or Trattoria del Tribunale, all with traditional cuisine.

Teatro Regio (5–7 min walk), Parco Ducale & Palazzo del Giardino -close to the meeting venue! à Aperitivo near Piazza Garibaldi at Enoteca Fontana, or Osteria dei Mascalzoni, or Ombre Rosse.

- **Key transportation links for international visitors to travel to Parma.**

BY PLANE - STRATEGIC LOCATION

It is easy to reach from four airports that are almost at the same distance and perfectly connected: the airports of Linate in Milan (120 km) and Marconi in Bologna (90Km) are about one hour's away by car; Milan Malpensa and the airport of Verona are slightly more distant. The Giuseppe Verdi airport of Parma is also active.

PLEASE NOTE: Transfer with shuttle bus to the city of Parma may be offered to Participants from the Airports of Milano Linate, Milano Malpensa, Milano (Orio al Serio-Bergamo), Bologna and Verona (separate quotation)

BY CAR - ON THE MAIN MOTORWAY JUNCTION.

University of Parma is less than 10 minutes away from the “Parma Centro” exit of the A1 motorway. Milan, Bologna and Verona are about one hour’s drive away. For additional information: www.autostrade.it

BY TRAIN - RAILWAY AND HIGH SPEED NETWORKS.

The Parma railway station is along the Milan – Rome line, i.e. it connects two of Europe’s most active railway stations, which compete with Bologna (another stop on this line) for the highest number of passengers in Italy. The Alta Velocità Medio Padana station in Reggio Emilia is less than 20 minutes’ away by car and it is connected to Parma via daily shuttles run by the Italo Treno company.
