DAY 1: Keynote Speakers



Margrieta Langins is the Nursing and Midwifery Policy Advisor at the WHO Regional Office for Europe in Copenhagen. Latvian-born and Canadian-trained, she holds degrees from McGill University, the University of Toronto and a Master of Public Health from EHESP in Paris. She is a fellow of the Queen's Nursing Institute and the Royal College of Surgeons of Ireland. Her career includes work in rural health, services for the homeless and pediatric nursing in Canada, as well as over 20 years of international experience. At WHO Europe, her work focuses on health and care workforce issues, long-term care models and primary health care.

Maggie works to position nurses and midwives as central to achieving Universal Health Coverage by strengthening their roles, working conditions and leadership in health systems. Since COVID-19, she has supported countries in improving workforce mental health, long-term care and continuity of essential services. Appointed in 2021, she now supports networks of Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers and leads the EU4Health Nursing Action initiative, improving data, employment quality, staffing, recruitment and retention across 21 EU countries.



Professor Rosaria Alvaro, MSN, RN, FAAN, FESC, is Full Professor of Nursing Science in the Department of Biomedicine and Prevention at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata," where she has served since 2012, and Pro-Rector for Social Innovation Policies. She holds extensive academic leadership roles, including Director of the Bachelor's Degree Program in Nursing Science (19 sites), Director of the Master's Degree Program in Nursing Science and Midwifery and Director of the Doctoral Program in Nursing Sciences and Public Health.

Professor Alvaro's research focuses primarily on organization, nursing student education, cardiovascular nursing, osteoporosis, and quality of life in chronic illness populations. She has been Principal Investigator on numerous funded research projects, including studies on self-care in heart failure patients and quality of life in families affected by stroke, funded by the Center of Excellence for Nursing Scholarship.

Her scholarly contributions include over 500 peer-reviewed publications in prestigious international journals and numerous books and book chapters. She serves on editorial boards and as a reviewer for leading nursing journals. Professor Alvaro has established significant international collaborations, particularly with researchers in the United States and Europe.

In 2019, she was inducted as Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, and in 2017 became Fellow of the European Society of Cardiology. She is currently the President of the Italian Society of Nursing Science. Her work continues to shape nursing science education and practice in Italy and internationally.

DAY 2: Keynote Speakers



Julia To Dutka is Chief of the Global Health Workforce Development Institute, a think-tank and solution-focused division of TruMerit (formerly CGFNS International), a nonprofit assessment organization dedicated to recognizing excellence in education and practice across the health professions worldwide. After her tenure as a professor and an academic dean, Dr. To Dutka was called to lead a global enterprise project transforming the TOEFL English language assessment system that measures communicative competence of learners worldwide. For the past two decades, she has served the global health workforce across the care continuum at TruMerit, bringing to her work cutting-edge insights that inspire change and transform lives. Celebrating the role of nursing as a leading force in delivering patient-centered care, Dr. To Dutka integrates her diverse academic, assessment, professional, and personal backgrounds and experiences to support critical inquiry and develop models that advance careers and facilitate mobility for nurses across the globe. Dr. To Dutka holds a BA (Hons) from The University of Hong Kong and an MA, EdM, and EdD, all from Columbia University in New York City.



A trained nurse, Mathilde holds a Master's degree in Education and Training Sciences and is a PhD candidate in Nursing Sciences at Université Laval under the supervision of Prof. Clémence Dallaire (Quebec). Her research focuses on integrating nursing knowledge into the clinical reasoning process within educational programs, with the aim of supporting the development of students' clinical competencies and strengthening the grounding of nursing knowledge in professional practice.

She is also a lecturer in Nursing Sciences at the University of Angers and collaborates with various nursing schools across Francophone Europe, engaging in the sharing and co-construction of innovative educational approaches in nursing education.

A member of the European Francophone Association for Nursing Diagnosis, Research and Clinical Reasoning (AFEDI), she advocates for the use of nursing diagnosis in nursing practice. Mathilde actively contributes to the scientific life of the discipline, notably as a member of the scientific committee of the Journal of Advanced Research in Nursing Sciences.

Her commitments and work have been recognized through several distinctions, including the Université Laval International Nursing Profession Award in 2022, as well as two excellence scholarships awarded in 2022 and 2025, highlighting the quality and relevance of her academic trajectory.

Through her research, teaching and international collaborations, she contributes to the advancement of nursing sciences by linking clinical reasoning, nursing knowledge and university education.

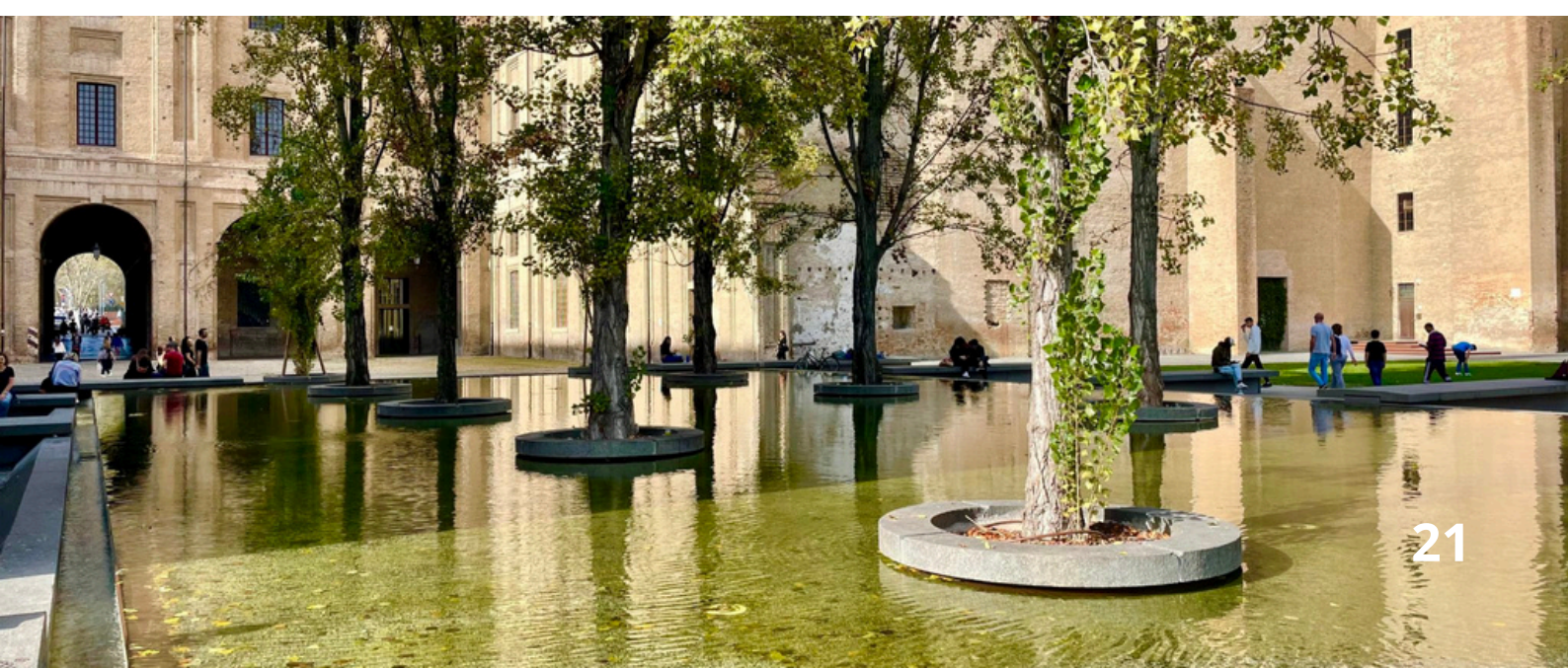

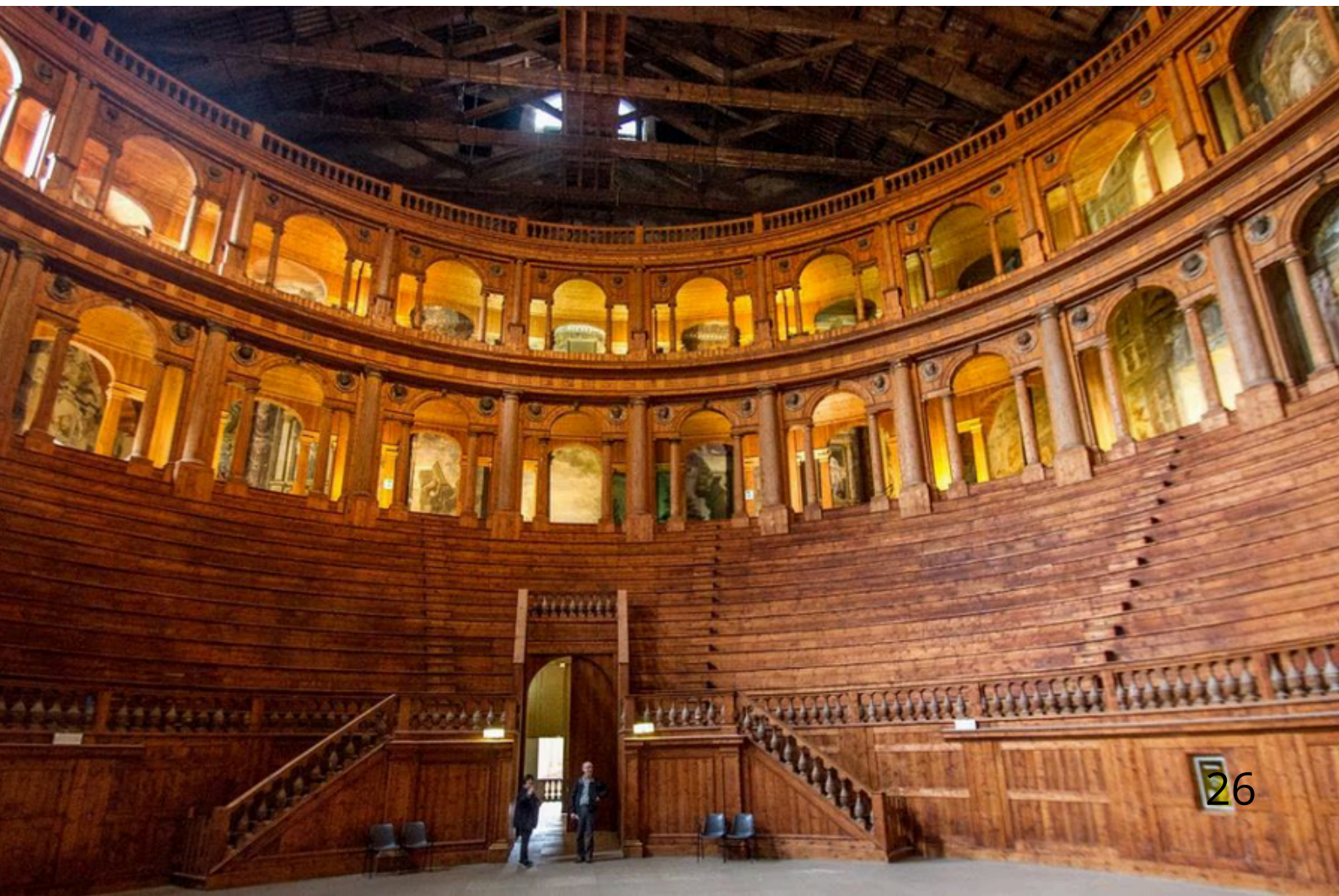
